I propose to "open" the ground floor of the existing building facing Uxbridge Road with the introduction of a new public function related to art and I made Cowley Road closed to traffic while introduction of a new pounic function related to an and I made Lowley Hoad dissect to framic while the access for cars is guaranteed from the back-street. This as a paradigmatical action for further and possible transformation of the borders of Uxbridge Road, nowadays blocked by the opacity of the shops and the facades. The intention is to bring the

street inside my site, through the existing building.

With the same intention of enlivening the pedestrian walkways I decided to extend the sidewalk into Cowley Road. So the ground becomes "one jiced" and people walking down Uxbridge Road will naturally turn into this retrained semiprivate space which is the "incipit" of a story.

My site-analysis started from the observation of the potential of the property walls and the existing gaps between each private house. Could those gaps might become a sort of visual-connections or pedestrian accesses? Could they become the rule of a new infitiration strategy?

So starting from these points, I tried to break the rigid pattern of the city which is a repetition of a flat sequence; green – building – green backyard.

The challenge of my project consists on the proposal of a residential complex that keeps the same qualities of the typical Georgian house but organized in a different way: a low rise-high density-complex that creates a form of urbanity reinterpreting the suburbana way of living. This means that I introduced the courtyards, the basements levels, the presence of the bricks, the research of a sort of bow window. But above all, I focused my attention on the definition of the boundary between the very private spaces and the very public ones by working the complex in section.
